ARE WE IN STEP WITH JESUS?

Twice in Jesus' ministry Luke records disputes among His disciples as to who would be the greatest in the kingdom on heaven(Lk 9:46; 22:24). In the first account Jesus had just spoken to His disciples about His death and resurrection. In the second account Jesus was preparing for His death. Imagine that while Jesus was preparing to suffer the disciples were preparing for what they would inherit after it.

The disciples reflect a certain quality that we all display when we allow our personal desires to take control. It's the desire for prestige and position. There's a part of us that wants to be in charge, in control, in front, in step and in command.

Jesus reminded them as He reminds us, that in order to be great one must first be a servant. Greatness in the kingdom is not defined by acceptance, adoration or approval but rather by our attitude. While we may not have been in the upper room when the disciples disputed over greatness, we still have to remember His death weekly. Do these moments lead us to submission or are we distracted by our selfishness? Are we focused on what it means to serve Christ or are we distracted by our own needs? Is it that Christ leads us to servitude or that our lusts lead to strife. Being in step with Jesus means that we understand what Jesus went through and are willing to go through the same. It means that just He had fellowship with the Father through humble submission to His will we recognize that our fellowship with Christ can only come when we submit to Christ.
