## HAVE WE MADE AN IMPRESSION?



In the ancient Eastern culture kings sealed important correspondence with a lump of wet clay, stamping the clay with a seal. These seals were engraved with semi-precious stones. The mark or impression left on the clay is the concept that is used in scripture to represent our Christian influence and example. The greek word "*tupos*" used of this "mark" primarily means "to strike or blow" and secondarily conveys the idea of "what is formed".

While this notion has been commonly expressed in light of the New Testament doctrine to which we must adhere, it also refers to the "pattern" of life that we live in order to make an impact on this fallen world. The apostle Paul uses this term to speak of mature brethren whose example we should imitate(Phil 3:17), the Thessaloonians who became examples in Macedonia(1 Thess 1:7) and his actions in order to be an example to others(2 Thess 3:9).

This concept informs us that God has not only called us to live distinctly from this world but also to make an "impression" on this world by our lifestyle. Our influence as Christians is not only by the doctrine we teach but by the doctrine we live. It is in this very sense that the Paul teaches that we will "judge" the world(1 Cor 6:2). We will judge the world by our lifestyle. God expects therefore that we live in such a manner that on judgement day He can use us as examples of holy living.
